

Season Permits – Condition of Issue – Naseby 2024 onwards

- 1. The holder shall be responsible for and release and indemnify of Canal & River Trust, their servants or agents, from and against all liability for personal injury (whether fatal or otherwise) loss of or damage to property or any other loss, damage, costs and expenses which may arise during or in consequence of the exercise of the permission granted. Permit holders are advised to take out individual insurance covering their third-party risks arising out of their angling activities.
- 2. In exercising the permission granted, the holder undertakes to comply with Canal & River Trust Byelaws or any specific rules or regulations which may from time to time apply. In particular anglers must ensure that they possess an Environment Agency Rod Licence and that all angling is carried out in accordance with the individual fishery rules and any Bye-law requirements.
- 3. The holder will not by any act or neglect cause injury to any person or damage to any property and will use his or her best endeavours to keep clear of any dangers whatever the nature.
- 4. The permit is not transferable, and it may be withdrawn by, and must be surrendered to the issuing office at any time on demand. All permits are non-refundable.
- 5. Only the name given on the permit is permitted to fish under that permit.
- 6. The permit is only valid at the fishery it is issued for.
- 7. Individual fishery rules apply. Please make sure you are aware of these rules before commencing fishing.
- 8. Permits should always be carried when fishing and must be made available for inspection by authorised members of Canal & River Trust staff or an appointed agent or fishery bailiff.
- 9. Fishing shall be carried out with a maximum of three rods unless stated to the contrary on the front of this permit.

Naseby Reservoir Fishery - Season Permit Rules 2024 onwards

- 1. Permits are not transferable and must be carried at all times whilst fishing. It is an offence under the Theft Act to fish without permission of the owner.
- 2. Pegs can be booked for a maximum of 72hrs (no return within 48hrs)
- 3. Naseby bailiffs, Canal and River Trust employees and Police on proof of identity are entitled to check permits at any time.
- 4. All cars are parked at the owners risk and parking should not take place on the reservoir access track or Carvels lane.
- 5. Canal and River Trust give no guarantee as to water levels in the reservoir.
- 6. In the event of an angler not adhering to the fishery rules Canal and River Trust and Naseby Carp Fishery 1645 retain the right to withdraw the permit without recourse to a refund and for that person to be excluded from fishing at any Trust fishery.
- 7. Canal and River Trust and Naseby Carp Fishery 1645 reserve the right to close part or all of the reservoir to anglers. Except in an emergency, details of any such closures will be posted on the fishery notice boards.
- 8. When night fishing, in the event that a match is booked on the peg that you are occupying, then fishing must cease at 6 am on the day of the match and you should be packed away and leaving site by 7 am.
- 9. Booked pegs which are not occupied within 90 minutes of the booking time slot will be reallocated.
- 10. Bivvies and other equipment should not be left unoccupied for more than 2 hours. Any equipment left unoccupied is entirely at the owners risk.
