

Where does the water come from?

Four reservoirs provide the majority of supply of water to the Peak Forest and Macclesfield Canals.

Toddbrook and Combs Reservoirs lie at the end of the Peak Forest Canal near Whaley Bridge.

Sutton and Bosley Reservoirs lie further south on the Macclesfield Canal above Bosley Locks.

Water from these reservoirs is also used to supply other canals further afield.

There are
no locks on the Peak
Forest Canal from
Whaley Bridge to
Marple, or on the
Macclesfield Canal
from Marple to
Bosley

This means
that the water in this
long pound can come
from any of the four
reservoirs. Sutton is the
smallest and closest to the
canal. For this reason it is
often used as a
quick top up

passes down Bosley
Locks, and is a significant
water source for the
Trent & Mersey and
Caldon Canals

Water from
the Peak Forest
Canal passes down
Marple Locks to the
Ashton Canal, and
onwards to
Manchester

Feeders also supply water to this canal e.g. Black Brook Feeder at Bugsworth

Following damage to the auxiliary spillway in Summer 2019, the Trust have held Toddbrook Reservoir down to ensure safety whilst repairs are undertaken
